2. Diary Sheets: Guidance on Keeping a Written **Record of Hate Crime**



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This information sheet is for LGBT people facing an on-going pattern of harassment that includes hate crimes or non-criminal hate incidents.

Why keep a written record?

When you are facing harassment (repeated unwanted behaviour that causes alarm or distress) over a number or weeks, months or years it can be difficult to remember details about everything that happened. Having a written record of each occasion when you are targeted, including dates and reference numbers, is useful in helping services to understand your situation and to take appropriate action. This guide suggests what information is useful to record. It also includes a diary sheet you can use.

What information should you include?


- What happened Try to be specific and concise •
- What was said Write the exact words used in verbal abuse •
- Who was involved If you do not know names, describe their appearance •
- Where did the incident take place Be specific about road names, bus numbers, etc. •
- Were there any witnesses Details of people who saw what happened •
- What was the impact on you How it effected you practically or emotionally
- Reporting details Reference number for the incident you reported to the police or date you reported it

What are diary sheets?

Diary sheets are written lists of instances when you were targeted. They can be written down on paper or saved as a computer file. Social housing providers and council anti- social behaviour teams often have their own diary sheets they provide you with, or you can use the diary sheet at the end of this factsheet.
